
## Vashon-Maury Island (Images of America) **Book Review**

Given the deep practical interest Island residents have in the Washington State ferry system (WSF) for obvious reasons, it would probably not come as any great shock to learn, somewhere in the sediments and mists of time-goneby, that some Vashon-Maury Island residents actually participated, at least in some small way, in the creation of the Washington State ferry system. Yes, but did you know that some of those residents made their contribution armed with clubs and apparently quite prepared to use them in... well, in the way traditional for clubs?

And did you know that at one time the notion of a bridge to Vashon was so popular with Vashon residents that the Garden Club featured a model bridge to the Island, bedecked with flowers, as the centerpiece of its annual flower show? This was news to my wife, the current president of the Vashon-Maury Island Garden Club.

These revelations and a surprising stream of countless others can be found in the pages of Vashon-Maury Island, a new book by Island historian Bruce Haulman and retired schoolteacher Jean Cammon Findlay, due out July 11. As noted on the back cover and back interior, this book is a new title in the Images of America series by niche publisher Arcadia Publishing which specializes in books on local history, typically written by local residents, in communities all across the nation. There are nearly 5500 titles in the Images of America series alone with thousands of other titles of historic interest in other series by the same publisher. Co-author Jean Findlay has another title in the Images series, The Mosquito Fleet of South Puget Sound.

As Bruce Haulman himself describes



it, Vashon-Maury Island is a photo history of Vashon-Maury Island and the first history of the island published for over 75 years; Oliver Van Olinda's The History of Vashon-Maury Island was published in 1935.

This book is an absolute musthave for any Island resident with any affinity for the Island. You'll find your friends, neighbors and often your family members in the list of people who have contributed to its content and production process, and every page bears information connecting people and places and names you know today, and probably see or drive by every day, with their origins in the past. My wife has a social dinner in a local social club nearly on a weekly basis with a man who "led an effort to develop a scenic overlook at Inspiration Point". I did not know this. ## **Italian Law Twist and Shout**

Giuliano Mignini, the Public Minister of Perugia Italy, is found guilty of Abuse of Power and Corruption for falsely accusing and prosecuting Amanda Knox and Raffaele Sollecito for the murder of Meredith Kercher.

Well, at least that is the fervent wish of every one of Amanda's family and friends on Vashon Island. The Seattle native, with deep ties to Vashon, is currently serving a 26-year sentence in Capanne Prison because of collusion and corruption. In the Trial of First Instance, back in 2009, vital evidence was destroyed or withheld, tainted evidence admitted, questionable witnesses sworn in, motions were blocked and defendants were silenced while prosecutors yelled. Rudy Guede murdered Meredith on November 1, 2007, during a botched robbery, and when her body was found the next morning Amanda stepped into the Twilight Zone; she had no idea she was a suspect by the evening of November 2nd. Why? Maybe Mignini needed to distract Perugia from his legal woes; maybe Guede had lots of Get Out Of Jail Free cards. Theories abound and whatever his reason Mignini began to corrupt Italian Law from the moment he laid eyes on the American girl whose parents were not rich or powerful. What is clear is that innocent, naive Amanda

served some purpose and Mignini thought no one would notice his everchanging, completely ridiculous stories, but skeptical bystanders saw right through the deception.

Guede's DNA was in abundance at the murder scene, his fingerprints and shoeprints in Meredith's blood. His skin cells and body fluids were found all over Meredith, in Meredith. Only Guede's DNA, no one else's.

Not One Molecule of Amanda's DNA was found in Meredith's bedroom, but she was tied to the murder with a kitchen knife from Raffaele's apartment. Raffaele was tied to the crime with essentially One Molecule of what may be his DNA on a bra clasp collected at the crime scene 47 days after the murder. It was located under a pile of debris across the room from its original position, as shown in the police video. Both items would never have been admitted in an honest courtroom.

On June 26, 2011, Rudy Guede appeared in court to rebuff the testimony from inmates in Viterbo prison. The men claimed that he had said, "Amanda and Raffaele were not involved," the same story in his recorded Skype call while he was on the run in Germany in 2007. Continued on Page 8

# Who Lives Under the Dock?





I just spent 2008 - 2010 in Mali, West Africa with the Peace Corps. Coming home I still have a strong spirit to keep on helping. Inspired by my volunteer experience with Habitat in Madagascar and Costa Rica I am excited to lead this trip to build in Malawi. So please come join me, Maridee Bonadea and Habitat for Humanity in exploring Malawi upfront and personal. We will all share in this service opportunity to help Habitat Malawi by building with a local family. What fun it will be to spend your vacation by making a difference in the world. No construction or building skills necessary.

#### About Malawi

Malawi, surrounded by Tanzania, Lake Malawi (Lake Nyasa), Mozambique and Zambia. Malawi is a country of gorgeous scenery and extremely friendly and welcoming people. The Great Rift Valley runs north to south, surrounded by mountain ranges and high plateaus. Malawi ranks among the world's least developed countries. The economy is predominately agricultural, with about 85 percent of the population engaged in smallholder farming.

About Habitat for Humanity in Malawi

Habitat for Humanity Malawi started in the capital city of Lilongwe in 1986. HFH Malawi is constructing houses of burnt clay bricks, cement floors and tile roofs. Over 5,000 houses have been built.

Types of construction for volunteers:

Typical work for Global Village team members may include: mixing mortar

#### Standard itinerary

Day 1 (Saturday): Depart from the United States.



### Island Life The Gas Belts by Peter Ray

When those ominous words came up on the screen- the truth is out thereduring an episode of that gone but not forgotten show, the X-Files, they could have been understood in a number of ways. From the spatial differences implied by off world alien encounters to the paranormal weirdness of the various metaphysical battles waged by the intrepid Skully and Mulder, the truth as defined by X-File parameters was definitely a fringe dweller no matter how one looked at it.

There is a kind of quirky romanticism to sasquatch hunts and UFO sightings that allows these tales to entertain and amuse. The problem is that, unlike TV fiction or cinematic hyperbole, when it comes down to getting the so-called goods, the reallife, actual video evidence comes off as amateurish and fake, which in many cases it probably is, although grabbing a camera to shoot what may be a once in a lifetime event does not always allow for the highest of production values. It was the lack of production values that first struck me when I sat down to watch the documentary Gasland. What I soon came to realize was that, in this case it was the story that was of paramount importance and its telling transcended any need for cinematic excellence.


It is another story that I'm concerned about at the moment, and I am dragging me feet and everything else in getting it told. As with many stories, the deeper one digs into it, the finds and the questions one discovers along the way require all that much more digging. To step away from the cryptic, what I have been looking into is the story behind the murals in the Vashon Theatre, and have been reading the books that Islander and artist Jack Tabor based them on. For a number of reasons they are taking on a greater significance than I had first thought, although that could all be selfserving speculation on my part.

The paintings on the wall on either side of the movie screen are based on Mr. Tabor's interpretations of the writings of one James Churchward, a British soldier who was shown some tablets while he was stationed in India. He was instructed in their basic meaning by an Indian priest, and this lead to the writing of six books in the 1920's and 1930's, which attempted to explain what they were all about. The tablets basically told the tale of an Atlantis story of the Pacific- specifically they speak of the lost continent of Mu, which disappeared beneath the waves some fourteen thousand years ago, taking with it cultural and technological advances as well as a population of some 64 million people. The reason Mr. Churchward gives for this cataclysm is the unleashing of powers contained in vast gas belts that encircle the globe in subterranean caves. Mu was supposedly the real cradle of civilization which all our now known early civilizations emerged from. There is evidence all around the Pacific rim of like imagery and iconography, as well as similarities in religion and mythology throughout the ring of fire. There is a giant rock structure that some call an ancient temple submerged in fifty to a hundred feet of water. One of the repeating images throughout the Pacific is that of the Easter Island head that appears on the mural to the right of the stage. Tabor titled this side of the mural, "Spectres of Ramaha", with the head and it's closed eyes representing the fact that Mu is dead.

and curious is the mural on the left, which Tabor titled "The Tree of Life". This is a significant icon in the imagery of Mu, and represents Churchward's belief through interpretation that the Garden of Eden actually existed on the lost continent of Mu, rather than in other more traditional cradles of civilization. What I find a bit odd in all of this, besides the obvious, is that Terrance Malick is now out with his latest film, the Tree of Life, which is apparently about middleaged disillusionment and a search for deeper meaning, all of which at least one person I know can directly relate to. Add to that the increase in seismic activity around the Pacific rim, an increase in in the poking and probing of the gas belts in these United States and around the world, and that darn Mayan calendar that ends next year. It's all very strange-I'll let you know what I find out.

owned by a recognizable family name, and two of their sons lost their lives in World War II. A name that you would probably associate with Christmas trees ties to a man shamefully sent off to an internment camp but who, even in the face of the insult, turned around and joined the 442nd Regimental Combat Team, "the most highly decorated unit in American history" and fought in Italy and France.

Almost every page in the book reads this way, every photo and every sentence connecting the Vashon of today to the Vashon of yesterday, yesteryear, and back through the centuries and millennia.

There were some elements of the book I found to be disappointing at first look. As it turns out, Vashon-Maury has a stunningly complex and deep history, and the book races you through it at breakneck speed. You no sooner bump up against some fascinating aspect than you are whisked away from it with the very next sentence. Countless topics and references shriek out for further detail but there is none. Additionally, I found the writing style sometimes distressing. A single paragraph would often contain ten entirely different topics more suitable to a bulleted list than a flowing paragraph.

I often found it quite difficult to discern satisfactory detail in many of the photographs. All the photographs are black-and-white, even if they were taken last year, giving one a disturbing sense that events you participated in only last year have suddenly become ancient history. No attempt has been made at photo restoration at all and many of the photographs could well benefit from modern techniques; I prefer to preserve the contents of historic photographs rather than to preserve how the photograph itself has been physically compromised. As it turns out, criticizing the book over these issues would be completely inappropriate. There are exceedingly rigid formatting and content requirements from the publisher for the Images of America series. Each and every book in the series must be EXACTLY 128 pages, no more and no less. All books in the series SHALL contain 180-240 vintage photos specifically, they must be black-and-white, and there shall NOT be any restoration performed. Essentially, the authors had to perform their magic within arbitrary constraints which would have driven me entirely insane. The fact that the authors

have operated within these limitations while at the same time producing a little miracle of a book constitutes a rather stunning accomplishment.

Potential readers of Vashon-Maury Island should, in my opinion, look at the book as a sort of photo-enhanced expanded index of Vashon-Maury history, a universal standard starting point to lay the initial foundational understanding of our local history and to plot sojourns of greater depth. The book is a literal treasure map that alerts you not only that there is treasure to be had, but it also yields clear pointers as to where you might go digging. The author's sources are well documented and the Vashon-Maury Island Heritage Association is close at hand. Personally, my copy of Vashon-Maury Island has sticky notes all over it already.

Locally, the book will definitely be available on publication day at Books By The Way.

But on the stand Guede stuck to the prosecution's story. Then PM Mignini read a letter supposedly written by Guede in the spring of 2010 referring to "a horrible homicide of a splendid young girl, Meredith Kercher, by Amanda Knox and Raffaele Sollecito." Defense lawyers said they did not know of the existence of the letter before it was read in court and Judge Hellmann chided Guede for not reading his own letter, questioning his knowledge of 'big words.'

Amanda was shocked and anguished; she tried to address the court but was denied her voice until after Guede left. She said, "The only time that Rudy Guede, Raffaele Sollecito and I were in one room together was in a courtroom. He knows what the truth is. I don't know what happened that night." Raffaele also spoke out, proclaiming their innocence, "Our lives have been destroyed based only on suppositions."

In hindsight we can see the twisting and breaking of the Italian Constitution, the Italian Code of Criminal Procedure, the American Foreign Affairs Manual and the Vienna Convention. Citizens of both Italy and the US are guilty of taking the Perugian theories at face value and some still cling to the belief that the kids were involved.

Nothing could be further from the truth.

The illegal 'softening up' process began before the interrogations. The kids were called into the police station at all hours of the day and night, depriving them of sleep, a key factor in the procedure. When the Illegal Interrogation took place, four days after the murder, they were mentally and physically exhausted.

recorded, but PM Mignini managed to sneak them into testimony during the Trial of First Instance.

The crime scene investigation. OMG. The entire crime scene was cross-contaminated by the end of the first day. Dr. Patrizia Stefanoni, head of DNA collection and processing, testified in court that she "only changed gloves if they were especially bloody." Several Youtube videos show the police in hazmat suits, no way to change footies, walking in and out of Meredith's bedroom, tracking her blood all over the apartment. Evidence was piled up, kicked around or moved indiscriminately. Millions watching said, "Wait a minute, the Perugians screwed up!"

Before the arrests the Perugians began leaking details and early reports show the set-up for the Sex Fueled Orgy Gone Wrong. After the arrests the stories became a rendition of the Reefer Madness trailer on Youtube and the laws that protect an accused from having their reputation smeared were violated.

On June 29, 2011 the Conclusions of the Independent Review of the knife and bra clasp were released to the press. It's already apparent that the Roman experts, Prof. Carla Vecchiotti and Prof. Stefano Conti, found the manner in which the evidence was collected and processed, by Dr. Stefanoni, shocking and were astounded it had been admitted as evidence. CONCLUSIONS:

"Having examined the record and conducted such technical investigations as shall be necessary, the Expert Panel shall ascertain:

1. Whether it is possible, by means of a new technical analysis, to identify the DNA present on items 165b (bra clasp) and 36 (knife), and to determine the reliability of any such identification.

- The tests that we conducted to determine the presence of blood on item 36 (knife) and item 165B (bra clasps) yielded a negative result.

The cytomorphological tests on the items did not reveal the presence of cellular material. Some samples of item 36 (knife), in particular sample "H", present granules with a circular/ hexagonal characteristic morphology with a central radial structure. A more detailed microscopic study, together with the consultation of data in the literature, allowed us to ascertain that the structures in question are attributable to granules of starch, thus matter of a vegetable nature.

- The quantification of the extracts obtained from the samples obtained from item 36 (knife) and item 165B (bra clasps), conducted via Real Time PCR, did not reveal the presence of DNA.

- In view of the absence of DNA in the extracts that we obtained, with the agreement of the consultants for the parties, we did not proceed to the subsequent amplification step.

2. "If it is not possible to carry out a new technical analysis, shall evaluate, on the basis of the record, the degree of reliability of the genetic analysis performed by the Scientific Police on the aforementioned items, including with respect to possible contamination."

Having examined the record and the relevant documents, we are able to report the following conclusions regarding the laboratory analyses performed on Item 36 (knife) and Item 165B (bra clasps):

### Healthy Snackables: Gluten Free Cookies

Italian kids are tested at age six for sensitivity to gluten, and 12% of them are reported to test as positive. I wonder if the percentage is any different in the USA, and right here on Vashon Island. Wheat is the worst offender. Most of my descendants, like me, are much healthier avoiding wheat and avoiding or minimizing consumption of other foods with gluten in them. Diabetics and those allergic or sensitive to sugar cane need to avoid or minimize sugar consumption, too.

The cookies below are not supersweet, just sweet enough to be recognized as cookies, not biscuits. Coconut sugar is lower on the glycemic index than cane sugar, therefore raises blood sugar less. Besides coconut sugar is lower on the glycemic index than cane sugar.

The little bit of barley flour in my Oatmeal Cookies contains only a smidgen of gluten, and to avoid gluten altogether you can replace it in the recipe with sorghum flour. Both Thriftway and the Minglement have all the flours mentioned in this recipe. These cookies make handy, healthy snackables and survival food. Kids of any age love them. Make some the next cool day.

regarding the attribution of the genetic profile obtained from these samples to Amanda Marie Knox.

Relative to trace B (blade of the knife) we find that the technical analyses performed are not reliable for the following reasons:

1. There does not exist evidence which scientifically confirms that trace B (blade of knife) is the product of blood.

2. The electrophoretic profiles exhibited reveal that the sample indicated by the letter B (blade of knife) was a Low Copy Number (LCN) sample, and, as such, all of the precautions indicated by the international scientific community should have been applied. 3. Taking into account that none of the recommendations of the international scientific community relative to the treatment of Low Copy Number (LCN) samples were followed, we do not accept the conclusions regarding the certain attribution of the profile found on trace B (blade of knife) to the victim Meredith Susanna Cara Kercher, since the genetic profile, as obtained, appears unreliable insofar as it is not supported by scientifically validated analysis; 4. International protocols of inspection, collection, and sampling were not followed;

In a large mixing bowl, melt the butter. It melts faster if you cut it in 8 to 10 slices.

Stir in the sugar. Stir in the eggs and the vanilla. Sift and stir in ½ of the dry ingredients in. Stir in the raisins and walnuts. Sift and stir in the remaining dry ingredients Stir in the rolled oats.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

While the oven heats, line two baking sheets and a pie pan with aluminum foil. Using two spoons, drop roughly round cookie dough balls onto the foil about 1 inch apart. You can roll the dough spoonfuls between your hands to make nice, regular rounded cookies if that is your will. When time is short, though, it's okay to make cookies no two of which are exactly the same shape.

Bake 15 minutes. Stick a toothpick into the tallest cookies. If it comes out clean, all the cookies are done. Remove the cookie sheet from the oven and let the cookies sit a minute to get used to the cooler temperature. Then slide them from the foil onto racks to cool.

You will have no baking sheets to wash, and these cookies leave the foil clean. Smooth it, fold it, and stick it behind your cookie jar to recycle into a base for your next batch of oatmeal cookies.

## Digging Wells in Darfur: The 100 Wells Campaign

In America it is easy to take the necessities of life for granted. We have water, food, and clothing in abundance or at least most of us do. The average American today lives better than most kings have in history. True, the economic crisis is certainly a game changer, but living within walking distance of a grocery store with ten different kinds of bottled water on the shelf (not including the flavored ones!) is a unique privilege. We have food and drink galore. We struggle to lose weight while the rest of the planet struggles to find the next meal. Gratitude for what we have, and a desire to help others who are less fortunate, is the only attitude that seems appropriate.

Americans also have the unique privilege of having most of our wars "over there" somewhere. My own faith community, Vashon Island Community Church, has two men who grew up among us serving in Afghanistan in the armed forces. One of our youth group graduates is joining the Marines this fall. If he faces combat it will likely be "over there" somewhere.

In recent years, one place that has not known either of these privileges is Sudan, Africa. Genocide and religious persecution has amassed untold numbers of casualties. Orphanages and refugee villages are still packed with the surviving victims of the violence. In these villages and communities clean water is often a scarcity. Many have tried and failed to dig successful wells in the Darfur region. One group that has had truly miraculous success is the Persecution Project Foundation, an organization that was started during the genocide to provide care and safety to the victims of religious violence in the region. Having begun successfully building wells in the region, the organization started the 100 Wells Campaign. Their slogan: "100 Wells. 100,000 People."

The youth group at Vashon Island Community Church, under the leadership of my wife Nichole Ivaska and youth group mom Kendra Malczyk, wants to get the people of Vashon involved in helping to build a well in Darfur through the 100 Wells Campaign. Allow me to quote the 100 Wells Campaign brochure:

"The Need: Approximately 80% of sickness in Africa is related to bad water. In Darfur, Sudan, the need for safe, clean water is critical. For the 2.5 million refugees forced to flee the genocide in recent years, it's a question of survival. Before community development can By Mike Ivaska

begin, there must be access to this basic necessity.

"The Impact: Water is life. Clinics, schools, churches and all other institutions rely on the availability of clean water. Persecution Project Foundation has taken on the challenge of providing safe, clean drinking water to genocide survivors in Darfur. During the last several years, we've seen the impact that water brings. Every freshwater well is helping transform settlements of sick and dying Darfuris into communities that once again have life, hope and vision for themselves and their children's future. The gift of one well can provide 500-1,000 people, as well as their animals, with clean water for the rest of their lives.

Please keep Amanda, Raffaele and their families in your prayers as we await Judge Hellmann's ruling at the end of July. If the court rules fairly we hope the kids will be out of prison by fall, but as we say:

It ain't over until Amanda's plane touches down at SeaTac.

I asked for and received for adoption two older special needs children and after twelve years of pouring every good thing I could find into them in the world and from myself, they are living lives vastly different than the ones they were destined for when the agency placed them and have lived to hear the words, "Thank you for all you did". Sole Deo Gloria. I joyfully love them unconditionally and delight in watching them aspire to lives of texture and substance. Sole Deo Gloria. And they made me a grandmother! Sole Deo Gloria.

Through naivite' and ignorance and a really obsessive Pollyanna complex I have repeatedly placed myself in harms



way with very angry, hurtful, self centered people. In every situation I have been delivered to safety and learned to be wiser, increasing in compassion and humor. Sole Deo Gloria. I have learned the power of forgiveness. Sole Deo Gloria. I have never sought revenge. Sole Deo Gloria.

### **Road to Resilience**

We are cruising down the middle of the river on our wonderful high-energy lifestyle with more miraculous and wonderful things to be had all the time. Meanwhile, the supposed dangers ahead are not only unseen, they have never before been seen by any human being. We do know that the temperature of the Earth has risen one degree in the last hundred years, and, with the output of greenhouse gasses growing every year, it will take considerably less time to reach 2 degrees. We know from the past that we can maintain some semblance of the world we now have if we can keep the rise within 2 degrees. The problem is that we have yet to experience the extent of climate change due to the concentration of gasses that we already have. If we immediately returned to our production levels of 1990, as is recommended, we would still have more warming in the years ahead. Perhaps it is no longer possible to keep the change within 2 degrees. The gasses do not dissipate readily; the past has shown that it takes about 1000 years for those gasses to get reabsorbed by the Earth after cessation of output. The consensus is that if we want to keep the temperature rise within 3 degrees in 2050, we need to start decreasing our output of gasses by

2015, very little time for such a radical change.

Will we really give up a high carbon lifestyle that will likely lead to our ruin? Will we have the courage to abandon our growth economy and invent a new steady state economy that pursues happiness and wellbeing rather than wealth and excess? Will we radically reduce our energy usage so we can generate all we need from renewables? Will we start to work with the web of life instead of trying to master it? This is where you write or call your representatives to tell them that the situation is not business as usual and you will support extensive lifechanging measures to lower our carbon footprint. Let's try to shake this lethargy before it's too late.

Folks, this is the most serious challenge our species has ever faced. Many other species have faced similar challenges, and most of them are extinct. The difference between us and them could be our mind, which allows us to plan ahead. Do we have the courage and wisdom to use it?




